Deferred Action for Childhood	
Who is eligible	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Current DACA recipients seeking renewal and new applicants, including individuals born prior to June 15, 1981, who meet all other DACA guidelines.
What the initiative will do	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Allows individuals born prior to June 15, 1981, to apply for DACA (removing the upper age restriction) provided they meet all other guidelines.• Requires continuous residence in the United States since January 1, 2010, rather than the prior requirement of June 15, 2007.• Extends the deferred action period and employment authorization to three years from the current two years.
When you can begin to make a request	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Approximately 90 days following the President's November 20, 2014, announcement.
